November 20, 2007

The Council agenda for November 20, 2007, includes beer permits and liquor license renewals for:

- Class C Beer Kwik Shop # 550, 715 24th Street
- Class B Native Wine Kitchen, Bath & Home, 201 Main Street
- Class B Liquor Country Inn & Suites, 2605 S E 16th Street
- Special Class C Liquor House of Chen, 2508 Ferndale (may be moving)
- Class C Liquor Reign, 2522 Chamberlain Street
- Class E Liquor, B Wine & C Beer Hy-Vee Wine & Spirits, 3615 Lincoln Way

A review of the Ames Police Department's records found no violations for Kwik Shop, Native Wine -Kitchen, Bath & Home, Country Inn & Suites and House of Chen. During a compliance checks, three people were cited for providing alcohol to minors and five were cited for possessing alcohol under age. The establishment had no involvement with the cases as the illegal activity took place outside of the store and really had nothing to do with Hy Vee Wine and Spirits. Reign/Outlaws had a total of two people cited for on the premises who both had fake IDs in their possession, four cited for possession of alcohol under age, two of those had fake IDs in their possession, and one juvenile was referred for harassment of a public official, possession of alcohol underage, and possession of a fake ID. This is total of nine charges to seven different people. Due to the cooperation of the establishment and the relatively low number of citations for a large establishment, the police department would recommend renewing Reign/Outlaws.
