City Exploring Property Standards for Residences

Over the years, concerned citizens have asked the City of Ames Inspections staff to consider enacting policies to address problem properties in the community. Common issues such as overgrown yards, debris stored on properties, and deteriorating exteriors

often are not covered by existing City of Ames ordinances. One way cities across Iowa have dealt with property complaints is by developing property maintenance codes. These laws establish a community standard for residential property and could apply to both rental and owner-occupied homes.

Establishing minimum standards for how owners maintain their property means walking a fine line between safety considerations, aesthetics, and property rights. What specific items would be considered? That is yet to be determined, but items typically addressed include height of grass, garbage and waste collecting in yards, excessive amounts of peeling paint or broken siding, safety issues with exterior stairways and decks, and garage or shed maintenance. As you consider these photographs of Ames properties on the right, it is important to think about how you would feel if you lived next door.

Before making a decision on whether or not to move forward with a property maintenance code, the Mayor and City Council are seeking public input. There will be several opportunities to share your comments about this issue.
