Hi Steve,

I have copied the full council on my reply in case they are interested in running with this further.

The reason why we collect the parking meter money is to pay for the parking infrastructure. Cities that provide their parking for "free" use general fund dollars (i.e., they spread those costs over the whole

community) whereas we require the one who benefits from the parking to pay for it. There is not a right or wrong way of doing this. However, if we were to make the parking "free," it is only "free" in the micro sense; the costs would be carried by the community broadly. Perhaps that's what we should do. We could treat them like other public amenities like our streets and parks.

Thanks for the note. A few points to clarify --

You did not take the loan out individually. This is an obligation of the entire community for a wonderful amenity that will benefit the entire community. A city like Ames needs an indoor pool. Be encouraged that the debt of Ames is very low.

Please note that we use bonds to finance many projects in Ames. The street you took to your house was financed with a bond. This is the common approach for financing public projects. The good news is that the cost of borrowing with municipal bonds is very low right now.

Dan Culhane has generously offered to fund raise \$10 million from the community. There are many community-minded people who understand the importance of a pool for children, older adults, and families. In fact, the vast majority of e-mails I have received have been extremely positive about our decision.

I was very proud to make the motion and cast my vote for this wonderful asset for the community.
