


# Program Update on Just the Facts...



January 27, 2009 Governing Board Meeting



**FACT:** As outlined below the Ames City Council (after public input) applied for and received its first allocation of Section 8 Rental Housing Certificates (now known as Vouchers) from HUD in 1979 to address the rental housing needs of low-income residents in the Ames community. Since that time the City has received the following allocations of Certificates/Vouchers for a total of **229:**

**FACT:** The City of Ames organization **does not** have to continue to administer the rental subsidy program. If the City would decide to relinquish its role in administering the program, HUD would be responsible for finding and selecting another Housing Authority to administer the program for the City of Ames jurisdiction. The City would forfeit its rights on how the program would be administered.

In fiscal year 2005-06, the City chose to "contract-out" the day to day administration of the program to another Housing Authority. Within 4 months, the City reclaimed full administration of the program due to differences in philosophy that impacted customer service to applicants, participants and property owners; and the City's overall culture and values.
