<u>SUBJECT</u>: APPROVAL OF STREET AND PARKING SPACE CLOSURES FOR THE MAIN STREET FARMERS' MARKET

BACKGROUND:

The Main Street Cultural District (MSCD) is working with the Ames Chamber of Commerce to host a Saturday Main Street Farmers' Market on Main Street, between Burnett and Kellogg Avenues, this summer. The plan is for the Market to be in operation from June 25 to September 24 in 2011. Hours of operation are scheduled to be from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. each Saturday.

In order to facilitate set-up and tear-down of the individual booths and to allow for general clean-up of the area, the street and parking spaces would need to be closed from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

City staff has had one initial meeting with MSCD representatives to discuss the plans for the Market and have been involved in the Advisory Board planning meetings whenever possible.

District representatives are in the process of contacting all businesses in the 300 block of Main Street to determine their support for the Market and hopefully identify any issues they may have. Staff believes there may be several businesses which are not in favor of this weekly market. While every effort is being made by the MSCD representatives to minimize the inconveniences to those businesses in the 300 block of Main Street, for the Market to exist in that location, the street and parking spaces will be closed to the general public for 8 hours each Saturday during the Market season.

The Council should also be aware that although the Market will not require the closure of Kellogg Avenue, Kellogg north of Main Street will be closed for pavement improvement during part of the summer. Staff and the MSCD still need to work out issues involving the Shrine Bowl Parade and the All-American Weekend. Those two events utilize this portion of Main Street at the time the Market will be in operation.

Since the Market will not be a special one-weekend or one-day event and will hopefully generate revenue for the District, City staff is recommending the City Council require reimbursement of the \$665 lost parking revenue and that Electric Utility be reimbursed \$1 per day for any outlets that may be used. To waive these costs may set a difficult precedent for any future requests from businesses wishing to use public property for extended periods of time for their businesses.

ALTERNATIVES:

- 1. The City Council may approve the closure of Main Street, between Kellogg and Burnett Avenues, from June 25 through September 24, each Saturday from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Parking spaces in the area will also be closed during these times. The Council will further require that the City be reimbursed \$665 for lost meter revenue, and \$1 per day for each electric outlet used.
- 2. The City Council may approve the requested closures of Main Street and the parking spaces but waive the requirement that the City be reimbursed for lost revenue.
- 3. The City Council may direct staff to work with the MSCD to find an alternate location for the Market.

MANAGER'S RECOMMENDED ACTION:

City staff realizes there may be some businesses and members of the public which may be inconvenienced by the closure of the 300 block of Main Street for 8 hours each Saturday from late June through September. There will be issues with being able to accommodate the Shrine Bowl Parade and All-American Weekend. We will work closely with the Chamber and MSCD staffs to address concerns as they arise. We will all work to try to minimize the conflicts with those who may leave their vehicles overnight after patronizing the bar/restaurant establishments in the area.

The positive impart of a vibrant Farmers' Market in the Main Street should outweigh the inconveniences which some may endure during its hours of operation. It will hopefully draw many people to spend the day and enjoy the businesses in the District.

Therefore, it is recommendation of the City Manager that the City Council adopt Alternative #1, and approve the closure of Main Street, between Kellogg and Burnett Avenues, from June 25 through September 24, each Saturday from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Parking spaces in the area will also be closed during these times. The Council will further require that the City be reimbursed \$665 for lost meter revenue, and \$1 per day for each electric outlet used.

In addition to the variety of vendors, the market will also provide live local entertainment, prepared food vendors, educational programming and children's activities each week.
