Program Timeline

11/24/2014 - FOG Control Ordinance approved by City Council

Spring 2015 - Collection of FSE contact information

7/1/2015 - 12/31/2015 - First review period

5/24/2016 - Revisions presented to City Council

1/1/2016 - 6/30/2016 - Second review period

7/1/2016 - 12/31/2016 - Third review period

Ongoing 6-month review periods




Grace Period – No penalty for non-compliance

Review Period Timeline

- 1st Notice Three weeks prior to end of period
 - Due one week after end of period
- 2nd Notice Day after initial deadline
 - Due 10 days after date of mailing
- Final Deadline
 - Submissions no longer accepted for compliance
 - List of non-compliant FSEs submitted to Customer Service
 - Letters are sent to non-compliant FSE

Cost of Non-Compliance


\$2.54/100 Cubic Feet

Results of Non-Compliance



- High traffic areas
- Typically occur outside of working hours
- Cost to the City

Changes to Consider

- Municipal Infractions
 - Establish schedule for offenses
 - Failure to submit information
- Grease Interceptors
 - Address use of interceptors uses in parallel/series



Training for Haulers

- Currently not being provided by the City
 - Available to meet with FSEs/haulers
- Des Moines WRA performs training
 - Topics covered are pertinent to City of Ames Program
- 17 of 18 have received training
 - 98% of the work performed in Ames



Receiving Hauled Waste



- Reduced fees by ~87%
- Increase in volume is expected
