At the January 14, 2020 City Council meeting, the City Council directed staff to bring back to Council a sales agreement on the property at 1420 Lincoln Way to Metro FiberNet, LLC, in the amount of \$21,600. This property is a former water booster pumping station.

Staff has received indication from Metro FiberNet that it is no longer interested in proceeding with the purchase of this property. Metro FiberNet has acquired property on North 4<sup>th</sup> Street for its operations through a private sale.

Staff will consider the City Council's referral closed.
