SUBJECT: BULLETPROOF VEST PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

BACKGROUND:

The Ames Police Department is again requesting permission to apply for funding from the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) program, and to participate in the program should funds be awarded. This program provides funds to local law enforcement agencies to support the purchase of new and replacement bulletproof vests for individual officers. This protective device is critical to the safety of police officers.

Bulletproof vests have an approximate five-year life cycle. The Police Department has a rotating schedule for replacement of vests for current officers. In addition, as new officers are added to the department, new vests must be purchased that are tailored to the individual officer. During FY 2021/22, the schedule calls for the acquisition or replacement of 12 vests.

The estimated cost for these vests is \$8,400. The grant requires that local agencies provide 50% of the cost. To the extent that federal funds are available, the BVP program will provide the other 50%. The FY 2021/22 Police budget was constructed with the expectation that the City would apply for and receive a Bulletproof Vest Partnership grant, so the Police Department's 50% share has already been budgeted as a commodities expense. The 2021 Bulletproof Vest Partnership grant application is due June 14, 2021.

<u>ALTERNATIVES</u>:

- 1. Approve the Police Department's application to and participation in the Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs Bulletproof Vest Partnership program.
- 2. Do not approve the Police Department's application for or participation in this grant program.

CITY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Bulletproof vests are an indispensable piece of safety equipment for police officers. Historically the Police Department has successfully participated in this program with the U.S. Department of Justice to provide protection to our local officers. Participation in this program allows the City to provide the best product to our officers with half the cost paid by the Department of Justice.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of the City Manager that the City Council adopt Alternative No. 1, as described above.
