SUBJECT: PRELIMINARY APPROVAL OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS AND NOTICE TO BIDDERS FOR WATER TREATMENT PLANT FIVE-YEAR WELL REHABILITATION CONTRACT

BACKGROUND:

In FY 2021/22, Northway Well and Pump Company will complete the final year of a five-year contract to rehabilitate 22 potable water wells. The contract involved rehabilitating the utility's drinking water wells on a five-year, preventative-maintenance cycle instead of waiting until wells are unable to produce adequate water volumes.

Upon completion of the five-year contract, well data continues to show this as being a successful project. Equipment found to be failing has been repaired, and significant increases in well yield have been realized. To ensure the current wells maintain their capacity for as long as possible, staff is asking Council to approve preliminary plans and specifications and to issue a Notice to Bidders for a new five- year cycle of the well rehabilitation program.

The specifications call for a one-year contract with four one-year renewal options. The initial contract will be effective through June 30, 2023. A consumer price index will be used to adjust the contract price for each subsequent contract renewal. Future-year renewals will be based on satisfactory performance during the prior year and on the City Council appropriating funds.

The FY 2022/23 Water Treatment Plant operating budget for well rehabilitation includes \$119,500 to rehabilitate five wells and an additional \$30,000 for repairs.

ALTERNATIVES:

- 1. Approve preliminary plans and specifications and issue a Notice to Bidders for a fiveyear well rehabilitation contract, setting July 13, 2022, as the bid due date and setting July 26, 2022, as the date of public hearing and award.
- 2. Do not approve plans and specifications at this time.

CITY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Regular maintenance of the city's potable water wells is required to ensure adequate source water to meet the city's current and future drinking water needs. It is in the City's best interest to maintain the wells by continuing the well rehabilitation program and adding another five-year cycle. Therefore, it is the recommendation of the City Manager that the City Council adopt Alternative No. 1, as described above.
